 - A: It's the "Assistance in Deploying Energy Efficient Technologies in Industries and Establishments," aiming to enhance energy efficiency among MSMEs with ₹1,000 crore budget.

 - A: Pressure from upcoming U.S. tariffs of up to 25%, contributing to rupee depreciation and a spike in bond yields.

 - A: A frugal economy model that emphasizes resource efficiency, innovation, and sustainability.
- 7. Q: Why are Indian companies facing earnings downgrades in 2025?
 - A: Because U.S. tariffs are slashing earnings forecasts—especially in labor-intensive sectors—potentially reducing GDP growth by ~1 percentage point.
- 8. Q: What did banking tycoon Uday Kotak suggest to PM Modi in response to U.S. tariff shocks?
 - A: He called for enhanced fiscal support to MSMEs in manufacturing, R&D, and tech to counteract the threat posed by steep tariffs.
- 9. Q: According to Nitin Gadkari, how will India achieve its \$5 trillion economy goal?
 - A: Through world-class infrastructure focused on roads, connectivity, and logistical efficiency.
- 10. Q: What growth rate does India's Finance Ministry say is needed amid uncertainties?
 - A: An annual growth rate of 8% over the next decade to achieve the Viksit Bharat vision by 2047.
- 11. Q: Which international body upgraded its India growth forecast to 6.4% for both 2025 and 2026?

 - A: GDP grew at 6.4% in FY25; projected between 6.3%-6.8% for FY26.

A: Exports rose by 6%, services exports were up 11.6%, and gross NPAs were at a 12-year low of 2.6%.

15. Q: What were India's FDI inflows and forex reserves at end FY25?

A: FDI inflows were \$55.6 billion; foreign reserves stood at \$640.3 billion (10.9 months of imports).

16. Q: What share of payment volume did UPI hold by end-2024, and what was its CAGR over five years?

A: UPI accounted for 83% of payment volume, with a CAGR of 89.3% in volume and 86.5% in value.

- 17. Q: What is the National Broadband Mission 2.0, launched in 2025 aiming to achieve? A: Extend broadband to 2.70 lakh villages, 90% of anchor institutions, and improve speeds to 100 Mbps by 2030.

> Security & Terrorism

1. Q: When and where did the deadliest attack on Indian civilians since 2008 occur, claiming 26 lives?

A: On 22 April 2025, in Pahalgam's Baisaran Valley, Jammu & Kashmir. The attack targeted Hindu tourists with AK-47s and M4s.

2. Q: Which terrorist outfit claimed responsibility for the Pahalgam attack?

A: The Resistance Front (TRF), a proxy of Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT), initially claimed responsibility.

3. Q: What was India's military retaliation following the Pahalgam attack?

A: Operation Sindoor, executed in May 2025, targeted nine terror camps in Pakistan and PoK, eliminating over 100 terrorists.

4. Q: Who documented Operation Sindoor in a new book, detailing deep strikes inside Pakistan?

A: Lt Gen K.J.S. Dhillon, in Operation Sindoor: The Untold Story of India's Deep Strikes Inside Pakistan.

5. Q: What major civil defense initiative did India conduct on 7 May 2025?

A: Operation Abhyaas, a nationwide civil defence mock drill across 244 districts to prepare for hostile threats.

6. Q: What is Bharatpol, launched in 2025?

A: A crime-monitoring portal by the CBI, aimed at enabling swift informationsharing among national and international law enforcement.

7. Q: Which international body has India engaged with to list TRF (The Resistance Front) as a terrorist entity?

A: The UN, including the UNOCT and CTED, following the Pahalgam attack.

8. Q: As per 2024 data, by what percentage did terror incidents decline over the past decade?

A: They declined by 70% due to India's zero-tolerance approach and strong counter-terror policies.

9. Q: What futuristic defence program did India unveil to counter terrorism threats?

A: The Sudarshan Chakra Mission, featuring predictive tech and precision systems for counter-terror actions.

10. Q: What significant security event occurred at the RSS headquarters in Nagpur in August 2025?

A: A ban on photos, videography, and drone use near the RSS HQ from 25 August to 23 October to strengthen security.

11. Q: What national counter-terrorism policy is India developing?

A: A unified Zero-Tolerance national counter-terror policy and strategy for central and state agencies, to be rolled out in 2025.

12. Q: According to IG Patil, what is the urban Naxalite's ultimate goal?

A: To hoist the "Lal Salaam" flag at Delhi's Red Fort, showcasing their expansion into urban zones.

 - A: A 60–70 kg IED blast in Bijapur, Chhattisgarh, killed eight DRG personnel and a civilian driver.
