Story 4: The Fox and the Grapes (Mixed Tenses)

A hungry fox walks through a garden. He saw a bunch of grapes hanging from a vine. He jumps to reach them. He tried again and again, but the grapes were too high. He becomes tired and gave up. As he walks away, he says, "These grapes are sour." He pretended not to care, but he feels angry inside. Next time, he will come with a stick or a ladder. He will not give up so easily. He will try harder and will get the grapes.

Story 5: The Honest Woodcutter (Mixed Tenses)

A woodcutter lives near a forest. One day, while he was cutting wood near a river, his axe slipped from his hand and fell into the water. He sat down and cried.

Suddenly, a fairy appears. She asked him why he was crying. He tells her the truth. The fairy went into the water and brought a golden axe. He says it is not his. She brings a silver axe, but he refuses again. Then she brought his iron axe. He smiles and says it is his. The fairy was pleased and gave him all three axes. Next time, if he drops his axe again, he will wait patiently. The fairy will appear once more, and he will speak the truth again. Honesty will always bring rewards.
